- Sept. 25 Krista Tippett's *Becoming Wise: Conversations with people whose insights kindle a sense of wonder and courage.*
- Oct. 23 *Moonglow: A memoir of Michael Chabon's grandfather.*
- Nov. 27 *Have A Little Faith* by Mitch Albom is based on two separate conversations between the author and two clergy, a New Jersey rabbi and a Detroit minister.
- Dec. 18 Kate Atkinson's *When Will There Be Good News?* is a crime novel that explores how the past can affect the future and how choices have lasting implications.
- Jan. 22, 2018 *The Underground Railroad* by Colson Whitehead is a novel that explores the foundational sins of America.

- Feb. 26 *Are We Smart Enough To Know How Smart Animals Are?* Frans de Waal, a Dutch-American primatologist, shows there is no clear behavioral division between animals and ourselves.
- Mar. 26 Amy E. Herman's *Visual Intelligence: Sharpen Your Perception, Change Your Life* is a guide to seeing what others do not.
- Apr. 23 *The Sellout* by Paul Beatty is a satirical novel about a narrator who tries to reintroduce slavery and segregation in his Los Angeles neighborhood.
- May 21 Edward P. Jones' *Lost In The City* is a collection of 14 short stories about African Americans in Washington D.C. in the 20th century
- June 11 *All Aunt Hagar's Children* is a continuation of the lives described in Edward P. Jones's *Lost In The City*.
